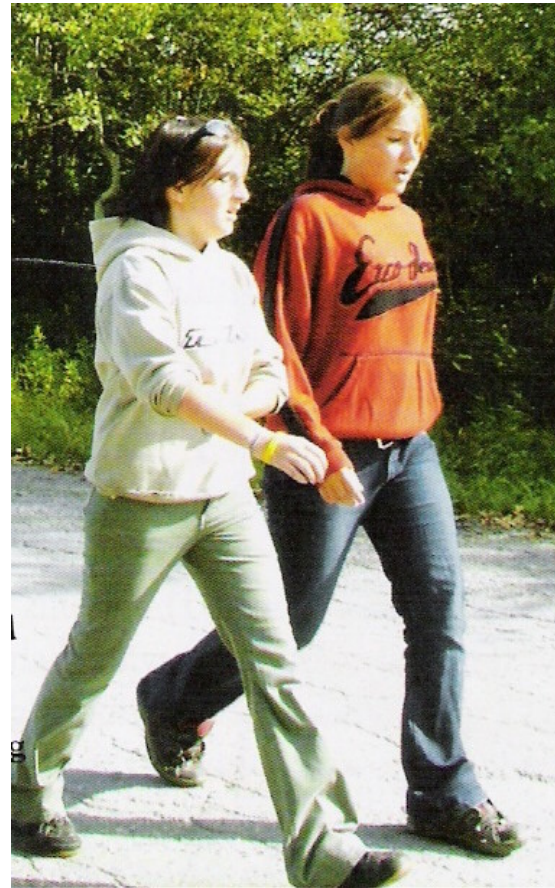


## Timmins High Supports Terry Fox Marathon of Hope

### Terry Fox Marathon of Hope, Quill 2005-06

In March 1977, Terry Fox had his leg amputated six inches above the knee. Although many would not have the motivation to continue with their lives, Terry believed in miracles. He wanted to raise \$1 million for cancer research by running in his Marathon of Hope. Terry ran 5,372 kilometers before he was forced to stop outside of Thunder Bay, Ontario. \$600 million has been raised in his name since that very first Marathon.

Every year, we at Timmins High come together to do our part for cancer research. This year we raised over \$1,200. \$600 went to the Terry Fox Foundation and \$600 went to Kyle Cooper's family, to whom we are wishing the very best. Although the contribution may seem small, Terry would be proud to see what his actions of twenty-five years ago are still accomplishing today.
